

ACROSS

- 3. metrical foot consisting of two accented syllables
- 8. combines two seemingly contradictory elements
- 9. details in a work that appeal to the reader's senses
- 11. accented syllable that ends a line
- 14. figure of speech making a direct comparison without the use of a qualifier such as "like" or "as"
- 15. six-line unit of verse
- 16. word(s) that imitate the sound of the thing spoken of
- 19. rhyme within a line of poetry
- 20. appears to be self-contradictory but nonetheless contains truth
- 22. metrical foot consisting of a stressed syllable followed by an unstressed syllable
- 23. exact repetition of sounds in at least the last accented syllable of two or more words
- 24. complicated verse form comprised of six sestets and a concluding tercet, with the end words of each line of the first sestet being repeated in the subsequent stanzas
- 26. metrical foot of two unaccented syllables
- 27. formal, ceremonious, & complexly organized poem; usually rather long & often commemorate an important event
- 29. manner of speaking about one sense in terms of another
- 31. presents an idealized view of rural life
- 36. line of verse that does not express a complete thought; rather, the thought continues to the next line
- 37. play on words with similar sounds or on a single word with different meanings

- 1. group of lines that form a division in a poem
- 2. regular pattern of stressed & unstressed syllables
- 4. figure of speech in which ideas, inanimate objects, or animals are given human qualities
- 5. most common meter in English poetry
- 6. process of marking the accented & unaccented syllables to indicate the meter
- 7. story or an account of an event or a series of events
- 10. rhyme of one-syllable words or stressed final syllables
- 12. metrical foot consisting of two syllables, the 1st unaccented, the 2nd accented
- 13. overall atmosphere
- 15. figure of speech in which a part of something is used to represent the whole
- 17. ordered patterning of end-rhymes
- 18. figure of speech in which one word or phrase is substituted for another with which it is closely associated
- 21. expresses an emotion or state of mind
- 25. author's attitude, whether stated or implied, about his or her subject matter & toward the audience
- 28. poetic form that usually comprised of five tercets, each rhyming aba, and a concluding quatrain, rhyming abaa, with the first and third lines of the first tercet alternating
- 30. humorous imitation of serious writing
- 32. understatement in which an affirmative is expressed by the negation of its opposite
- 33. four-line stanza
- 34. fourteen-line lyric poem, written in iambic pentameter & with a set rhyme scheme
- 35. figure of speech that compares two unlike things to highlight something they have in common; uses a connective such as "like," "as," or "than"
